Our region is home to some of Tasmania's most iconic historical towns and includes two World Heritage Convict Sites: Woolmers and Brickendon.

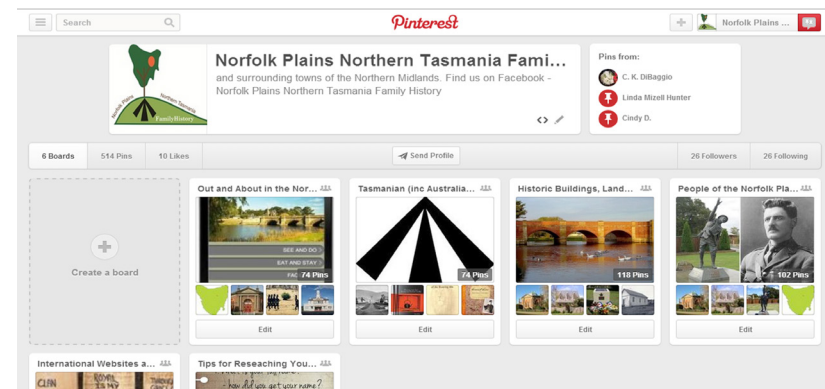
